NB: on the grammar test, you can save time by abbreviating your answers. However, you will have to use the exact convention that follows (cf. Mitchell and Robinson in the introduction to their glossary), or else I will not be able to read your answers! Examples:

ns	nominative singular	nas	nominative or accusative singular
as	accusative singular	gds	genitive or dative singular
gs	genitive singular	ds/dp	dative singular or dative plural
ds	dative singular	np	nominative plural
is	instrumental singular	nap	nominative or accusative plural

For verbs, you may use the following system:

3s pret str	third person singular preterite tense strong
1p pres	first person plural present tense
2p pret wk	second person plural preterite tense weak

Only use abbreviations if you can do so legibly and systematically!
